

- **Day 1 Travel to Rome** Today, you will be transferred by private motorcoach from the Yorkville, IL area to the Chicago O'Hare Airport for your overnight flight to Rome.
- Day 2 Rome This morning arrive in beautiful Rome! After claiming your luggage, you will be met by your tour guide who will escort you to your private vehicle for transfer to the Hotel Massimo D'azeglio. Check into your hotel and the afternoon is yours to explore the city. This evening, enjoy dinner at the hotel restaurant an old wine cellar. Appetizer, main course, and dessert are included.
- Day 3 Rome City Tour Board the Norwegian Getaway After breakfast, meet your local tour guide for a tour of Rome. Drive by the Coliseum, stop at Trevi Fountain, and walk to the Piazza Navona. After the tour, you will be transferred to the port of Civitavecchia to board the Norwegian Getaway for an Eleven Day Mediterrean Cruise. Stroll The Waterfront, an innovative, industry-first open-air promenade designed to connect guests with the ocean like no other cruise line.
- Day 4 Day At Sea Today is a full day at sea. Indulge in more than 28 dining options, experience the thrill of five water slides, and three levels of action-packed activities in the sports complex. The excitement and entertainment continues with Broadway musical Million Dollar Quartet. Get ready to explore history up close in Europe, or just relax at sea.
- Day 5 Kotor, Montenegro Messina has played a major role in European history since its founding as a Greek colony in the 8th century B.C. During the Roman Empire, the city was a major port and commercial center, during the Middle Ages, Messina was the major port of departure for Crusaders. History has also left its scars: a massive earthquake leveled much of the city in 1908 and the World War II campaign for Sicily devastated Messina. Yet Messina emerged from that devastation with some of its historic treasures intact, including the 12th-century Annunziata dei Catalani Church. Messina is also your gateway to the rugged beauty of southeast Sicily, from the seaside resort of Taormina to Mt. Etna. Between the fall of Rome and the 1861 unification of Italy, the Arabs, the Normans, the Germans, the Spanish and the French ruled Sicily.
- Day 6 Dubrovnik, Croatia Thick 16th-century stone walls encase the entire Old Town of Dubrovnik. But there are no boundaries on the endless adventures you'll discover among its orange-roofed ramparts. With a made-for-TV appeal— Game of Thrones was actually filmed here— the city commands your attention with the perfectly preserved Rector's Palace, elaborate Onofrio's Fountain, and baroque St. Blaise's Church, named after the city's patron saint. You can browse museum collections showcasing Croatian artwork, period furniture and shipbuilding traditions. Or to get your heart pumping, go cliff diving into the sea and kayak crystal blue waters, with the 'Pearl of the Adriatic' shimmering in the distance.
- Day 7 Corfu, Greece Perched above the Adriatic Sea, Corfu, Greece is the second largest Ionian island, and its size is rivaled by its tremendous history and dynamic cultural identity. Cruise to Corfu and walk through the narrow streets of Old Town, and marvel at the Italianate architecture left from centuries of Venetian rule. A number of scenes from the James Bond film "For Your Eyes Only" were filmed in the capital city of Corfu, and you'll understand why when you see the epic coastal roads and immense fortresses buttressing the town. With its rich combination of old fishing villages and immaculate beaches, Corfu is the perfect place to get lost in time during your vacation.

- Day 8 Santorini, Greece Santorini is one of the world's most popular islands, known best for its dramatic scenery, whitewashed villages and fiery volcanic activity. Here adventure bubbles above the Aegean Sea in the most bold and breathtaking ways. A cable car takes you to the capital of Fira, a bustling cliff-top town awash with old cathedrals, enthralling museum collections and cozy tavernas. Venture to the coast for a swim in the deep blue waters that lap red and black pebbled beaches. And peel back layers of lava and history among excavated Akrotiri. Whether it's by bicycle, ATV or on your own two feet, exploring this Cyclades isle never fails to impress.
- Day 9 Mykonos, Greece Nestled in the heart of Greece's Cyclades archipelago, Mykonos pulses with irrepressible energy. With its powder white houses, sparkling blue waters, and red-hot nightlife, The Island of the Winds is as colorful as the people who call the island home. You can walk narrow marble pathways laced with purple bougainvillea blooms, or go cycling on two wheels past off-the-path Ano Mera village. Explore Greece's maritime history at Armenistis Lighthouse, and check out the Folklore Museum's Mykonian ship models. Join in the raucous beach party on Super Paradise's shimmering sands, or watch the sun burn out beyond an Aegean horizon from an open-air seaside taverna.
- Day 10 Pireaus (Athens), Greece Athens offers a looking glass back in time into Greece's powerful ancient civilization. Art lovers, epicureans and history buffs will be delighted by the ancient ruins, museums and tavernas of this picturesque town. You'll find the Archaeological Museum of Piraeus, filled with sculptures from the Bronze Age to the Romans. Walk to the Zea Harbour to discover how the Hellenic Maritime Museum will bring to life the grandeur of ancient Greece's naval capacities. Jump onboard an Athens cruise and relax at the small harbor of Mikrolimano, enjoying a meal of grilled octopus and chilled white wine at a small restaurant overlooking the sea.
- **Day 11 Day At Sea -** Today is a full day at sea. Take advantage of all the amenities the Norwegian Getaway has to offer.
- Day 12 Naples/Pompeii Italy Italy's third-largest city, Naples is a bustling metropolis famed for its stately buildings, crowded streets, pizza and notoriously bad traffic. However, this beautiful city is rich in centuries-old culture and customs. Naples is also your gateway to the Isle of Capri, the fabled Amalfi Coast and the ruins of Pompeii, buried in ash by the cataclysmic eruption of Mt. Vesuvius in 79 A.D. Naples boasts an ideal location, with both the ruins of Roman cities and the stunning Amalfi Coast in easy reach.
- Day 13 Livorno (Florence/Pisa), Italy Livorno is the gateway to glorious Tuscany. Visit Florence the cradle of the Renaissance home to the Duomo, the Uffizi and the Ponte Vecchio. Here the Medici fostered a city-state whose cultural legacy is as great as classical Athens. Giants like Dante, Da Vinci, Michelangelo and Galileo infused the West with a new creative spirit. Then there is Pisa, Florence's rival for political power. Pisa, a brash, commercial seafaring town rivaled the great maritime powers of Venice and Genoa. The city was a leader in art and architecture second only to Florence.
- Day 14 Rome (Civitavecchia), Italy This morning this ship arrives back in Civitavecchia. You will be transferred to the Rome airport for your flight back to Chicago. On arrival, a motorcoach will be waiting to take you back to your originating point.
